

*Government Notice No. 52 of 2014***THE CENTRAL WATER AUTHORITY ACT****Regulations made by the Central Water Board, with the approval of the Minister, under section 49 of the Central Water Authority Act**

1. These regulations may be cited as Central Water Authority (Water Supply for Non-Domestic Purposes) (Amendment) Regulations 2014.
2. In these regulations –  
“principal regulations” means the Central Water Authority (Water Supply for Non-Domestic Purposes) Regulations 2011.
3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting, in the appropriate alphabetical order, the following new definition –  
“road reinstatement” means the carrying out of works to reinstate a road to its original state;
4. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking paragraph (2) and replacing it by the following paragraph -  
(2) The fees payable under paragraph (1)(b) shall be the fee for a new water supply without road reinstatement or the fee for a new water supply with road reinstatement, where applicable, as specified in Part A of the Second Schedule.
5. Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following regulation –  
**20.** (1) Where a consumer wishes to have his water supply discontinued, he shall –
  - (a) make a written application to the Authority in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule; and

- (b) produce his National Identity Card together with documentary evidence that all water charges and waste water fees, charges and rates in relation to that water supply have been settled as at the date of the application.

(2) Where a consumer uses water supplied to him for different non-domestic purposes, the water charges payable by him shall be calculated using the water rate which is the higher of the rates for non-domestic purposes.

6. Regulation 21(6) of the principal regulations is amended by revoking subparagraph (b) and replacing it by the following subparagraph –

- (b) where the water supply is discontinued from main, the fee for a new water supply without road reinstatement or the fee for a new water supply with road reinstatement, where applicable, as specified in Part A of the Second Schedule;

7. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is amended by deleting Part A and replacing it by Part A set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

8. These regulations shall come into operation on 1 April 2014.
